# ANNUAL PETROLIA NEW YEARS' LEVEE TO BRING VIRTUAL GREETINGS AND AWARD GRANTS

The tradition of the levee started in the 17th century with King Louis XIV as his opportunity to welcome select subjects to his bedchamber at the start of a new day. The custom spread through Great Britain in the 18th century as a formal court reception hosted for men in the early afternoon.

The association between the levee and New Year's Day began in Canada as this was the day that fur traders paid their respects to their government representatives.

The\_first formal Canadian levee was recorded on January 1, 1646 in the Chateau St. Louis by Charles Huault de Montmagny, the Governor of New France (later Québec). During the levee, Huault de Montmagny greeted residents and shared the state of affairs within the area.

Today, the format of the levee has changed considerably but the idea of having residents welcomed by their local government at the start of a New Year is alive and well in Petrolia.

Due to the COVID-19 world pandemic, the Petrolia Levee hosted by the Petrolia Heritage Committee will not proceed as it has for the past several years. This year's levee and Petrolia Community Fund Grant presentations will be brought to the community as a video with greetings from Mayor R. Brad Loosley, Petrolia Heritage Advisory Committee Member, Marty Dillon and Community Micro Grant Presentations from Jane Anema, Executive Director, and fellow members of the Petrolia Community Fund.

The video will be published at 1:00 p.m. on January 1, 2021 and will be available via link on the Town website (<a href="www.town.petrolia.on.ca">www.town.petrolia.on.ca</a>), on the Town of Petrolia You Tube Channel, or on the Town of Petrolia Facebook Page.

The Town of Petrolia would like to thank the Petrolia Heritage Advisory Committee for their work to keep this tradition alive in Petrolia each year, and to the Petrolia Community Fund for their generosity.

- Styrofoam is not recyclable.
- Any paper items are recyclable but remember to remove personal information prior to recycling.

# TOWN OF PETROLIA FACILITIES CLOSURES/CANCELLATIONS NOTICE EFFECTIVE 12:00 p.m., THURSDAY, DECEMBER 24, 2020

As per Provincial guidelines, we will be entering a Provincial shutdown effective 12:00 p.m., THURSDAY, DECEMBER 24.

Staff are continuously monitoring developments around coronavirus (COVID-19), and we continue to look to the Public Health Agency of Canada, Public Health Ontario, and our various municipal health experts for recommendations, guidance, and direction.

For the safety of our residents and staff, the decision has been made to close the Town of Petrolia Municipal Office to the public effective 12:00 p.m., THURSDAY, DE-CEMBER 24. Regular hours will continue from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday after the scheduled holiday closure from deep cleaning until January 4, 2021. Staff will be available to respond to resident needs and requests by telephone to (519) 882-2350 or by e-mail to the specific staff member you require or to our general inbox at petrolia@petrolia.ca. Please also follow the Town of Petrolia on Facebook, Twitter and check our website (www.town.petrolia.on.ca) for regular updates. We have a mail slot available for anyone that wishes to drop any correspondence or payments off at the Municipal Office to be processed by staff. At this time, the Municipal Office closure to the public will proceed until further notice.

All essential services will be maintained including water, wastewater, snow removal, salting, curbside waste collection and recycling collection and cemetery services. The staff of the Town of Petrolia are dedicated to maintaining the level of service that is expected from residents.

"We understand that this may be challenging for some residents, but for the health and safety of our community we are encouraging social distancing and limiting all non-essential contact. The wellness of our community is of paramount importance. Please stay home if you are able and take care of yourself and your families" Said Mayor R. Brad Loosley. Continued on page 5.



#### WINTER MAINTENANCE NOTICE

#### Snow Removal

- Under the Highway Traffic Act Section 181 Deposit of snow on Roadway, states that "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry of Transportation or the road authority responsible for the maintenance of the road."
- This generally applies to the snow that accumulates in laneways from precipitation and from private or municipal snow plowing operations, those who insist on plowing snow from private property onto public roads can be fined

#### Overnight Parking

- Residents are reminded there is no overnight parking on Town streets between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- This allows for the Town's Road Crews to plow the roads safely and efficiently, we ask that you please abide by the by-law and be considerate of the road crews when they are out doing their best to keep our roads open and in safe condition

#### Parking on roadway

Under the Highway Traffic Act Section 170.

#### Vehicles interfering with traffic

(12) Despite the other provisions of this section, no person shall park or stand a vehicle on a highway in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of traffic or the clearing of snow from the highway. R.S.O. 1990, c. H.8, s. 170 (12).
