



PROVINCIAL GUIDELINES CHANGE POLICY AT INDOOR MUNICIPAL FACILITIES IN PETROLIA

Following Premier Doug Ford's announcement on September 1, 2021, the Town of Petrolia will be changing facility policies to adhere to Provincial requirements and guidelines effective, Wednesday, September 22, 2021.

"...Safety is our priority and by working under the new Provincial guidelines, it will help our facilities with the goal of a safe re-opening and continued safety for all users." Said Chief Administrative Officer, Rick Charlebois.

As of September 22, 2021, visitors will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days waiting period) and provide proof of vaccination along with approved Provincial I.D. to access the following Town of Petrolia facilities: Victoria Hall for the purpose of meetings, events, films and theatre performances***, Greenwood Recreation Centre*, and the Petrolia YMCA**.

*Greenwood Recreation Centre policy includes:

Any **spectator** 12 years of age or older will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days waiting period) and provide proof of vaccination along with approved Provincial I.D. upon entry Children 11 years of age and younger will be admitted with a fully vaccinated adult aged 18 or older. Any **participant** in an organized sport, under 18 years of age will follow the policy set forth by their individual organizations.

Any **participant** 18 years of age or older will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days waiting period) and provide proof of vaccination along with approved Provincial I.D. upon entry.

Only exemptions:

- Those 11 years of age or younger with a fully vaccinated adult aged 18 or older.
- Those with written proof of a medical reason, provided by a physician, that sets out: That the person cannot be vaccinated against COVID-19; the medical reason; and the effective period for the medical reason (i.e., permanent or time-limited).
- **Petrolia YMCA policy includes:
- Any participant/spectator who is 12 years of age or older will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days waiting period) and provide proof of vaccination along with a approved Provincial I.D. upon entry
- Children 11 years of age and younger will be admitted with a fully vaccinated adult aged 18 or older.
- Any person 12 years of age or older will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days waiting period) and provide proof of vaccination along with approved Provincial I.D. to enter the facility.

 Any participant in swimming lessons under 12 years of age will not require proof of vaccination

Only exemptions:

Those 11 years of age or younger with a fully vaccinated adult aged 18 or older.

***Victoria Hall policy includes:

- Any visitor 12 years of age or older attending for the purpose of meetings, events, films, and theatre
 performances will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days waiting period) and provide proof of
 vaccination along with approved Provincial I.D. upon entry
- Children 11 years of age and younger will be admitted with a fully vaccinated adult aged 18 or older.

Only exemptions:

- Those 11 years of age or younger with a fully vaccinated adult aged 18 or older.
- Those with written proof of a medical reason, provided by a physician, that sets out:

That the person cannot be vaccinated against COVID-19; the medical reason; and the effective period for the medical reason (i.e., permanent or time-limited)

• Those attending Victoria Hall for Municipal Services (example tax payments, dog tags, etc.)

This requirement does *not* apply to outdoor facilities owned and operated by the Town of Petrolia including parks, the Petrolia Farmers' Market, and playgrounds, nor does it apply to Municipal Services at Victoria Hall.

Starting September 22, 2021, Ontario residents are asked to download a copy of their COVID-19 vaccination records so that it can be shown to gain entry to facilities that are included in the new guidelines. The Province of Ontario will be introducing a digital vaccine receipt that features a QR code for safe and secure proof that is portable and easily accessible and that will be utilized once it is in place.

Your Responsibilities as a PROPERTY OWNER

The Town of Petrolia would like to remind property owners of the following responsibilities that apply to your property and its use:

- Please ensure that your property is generally well-maintained, free of waste/ refuse and drained at all times.
- All buildings, structures, landscaping (including tree planting) and any other features must be kept within the boundaries of your property.
- No waste of any kind is to be deposited onto another property.
- No clearing or change of vegetation is allowed on property that is outside your property's boundaries.
- Ensure that no drainage waters are diverted to neighbouring or municipal properties
- Weeds and grass are to be maintained at a height of 8 inches (20 cm) or less.
- Ensure pool water, surface drainage and grading is maintained on your property and that it does not affect neighbouring properties.
- Ensure pool backwash waters are not discharged to sanitary or storm outlets and that all drainage is maintained within your property's boundaries.

- If you have a swimming pool or plan to install a swimming pool, you must comply with the Municipal Pool By-Law and the pool and fence/enclosure must be maintained in accordance with the By-law
- Any structure which is 108 square feet (including covered areas) or less does not require a building permit, but the structure must comply with all applicable law, which includes the Petrolia Zoning By-law and the Ontario Building Code. Any structure larger than 108 square feet is subject to building
- Please take notice that if any Municipal By-Law violation(s) is not remedied within the time specified in an issued Order, the Municipality may correct such violation by repair or clearance at the expense of the Owner and without further notice to the Owner - which includes all expenses associated with the administration and enforcement of all Municipal By-Laws.
- The Town of Petrolia thanks all residents for their efforts in keeping the Town an attractive and quality community.

WINTER MAINTENANCE NOTICE

Snow Removal

- Under the Highway Traffic Act Section 181 Deposit of snow on Roadway, states that "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry of Transportation or the road authority responsible for the maintenance of the road.
- This generally applies to the snow that accumulates in laneways from precipitation and from private or municipal snow plowing operations, those who insist on plowing snow from private property onto public roads can be fined

Overnight Parking

- Residents are reminded there is no overnight parking on Town streets between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- This allows for the Town's Road Crews to plow the roads safely and efficiently, we ask that you please abide by the by-law and be considerate of the road crews when they are out doing their best to keep our roads open and in safe condition

Parking on roadway

. Under the Highway Traffic Act Section 170.

Vehicles interfering with traffic

(12) Despite the other provisions of this section, no person shall park or stand a vehicle on a highway in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of traffic or the clearing of snow from the highway. R.S.O. 1990, c. H.8, s. 170 (12).

Sidewalks

- · Under By-Law Business owners are required to maintain the front area of their storefront, this includes the removal of snow
- The Sidewalk Plow will make its way through Town once permittable, Roads are the priority for Works Crew once they are clear Sidewalks



LEO's 'Break the Ice-olation' Campaign Kicks Off

Lambton Elderly Outreach Introduces New Winter Campaign Aimed at Awareness & Reduction of Social Isolation

SARNIA + PETROLIA—September 28, 2021: Lambton Elderly Outreach (LEO) is launching a three month Break the lce-olation campaign to 'break' the feelings of social isolation, which have been particularly exacerbated with the pandemic.

"Research shows that social isolation of older adults and people with disabilities can lead to increased risk of loneliness, depression, and health issues," commented Paula Reaume-Zimmer CEO, Lambton Elderly Outreach. "Older adults and those with disabilities are most at risk because they have often faced factors such as loss of family and friends, living alone, and have been the most vulnerable throughout the pandemic."

October through January, LEO is teaming up with various community partners to offer six specific initiatives as part of the inaugural *Break the Ice-olation* campaign. Together these events provide opportunities for various groups to connect, learn about LEO resources, have fun, and decrease isolation:

Break the Ice-olation Campaign Kick-Off - National Seniors Day

On Friday October 1, from 1-3pm at the Petrolia YMCA and the Sarnia Strangway Centre, LEO will be hosting and handing out free ice cream, music, and receive a take-a-way package of community programming options. 



ADDITIONAL PLANNER HOURS AT PETROLIA MUNICIPAL OFFICE

Petrolia is growing again with many current and potential developments on the horizon and is seeing a surge in residential property improvement projects. To continue to provide excellent service to residential, commercial, industrial developers, and residents the Town of Petrolia is pleased to announce that County of Lambton Senior Planner, Rob Nesbitt, and Planner Phil Rough will be working out of the Petrolia Municipal Office a total of four full days each week.

The County of Lambton and the Town of Petrolia have partnered for more than 20 years with a shared Planner, and Clerk, Mandi Pearson said, "As part of our commitment to provide the best customer service to developers and residents, and to help make the development process easy for them, we are pleased to have a Planner at the Petrolia Municipal Office four days per week."

The role of the Planner is to help the town determine the best way to use land and resources. They help draft land use policies and review proposed developments. In addition, the Planner meets with public officials, developers, staff, and the public regarding development plans and land use. They gather and analyze economic and environmental studies, censuses, and market research data, and conduct field investigations to analyze factors affecting land use.

Planner hours at the Petrolia Municipal Office are Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Residents are welcome to visit the Municipal Office on either of these days to speak with a Planner regarding your planning items. Appointments are strongly encouraged and can be arranged by reaching out to Mr. Nesbitt. All COVID-19 restrictions continue to be followed, and as a reminder, masks are required, and those attending in-person meetings are asked to register upon arrival.


