

Let's get back to the basics of recycling.

**Remember these three rules
each time you recycle:**



1 Recycle all empty plastic bottles,
cans, paper and cardboard.



2 Keep food and liquids
out of the recycling.



3 Empty recyclables
directly into your cart
– NO bagged recyclables.

A helpful guide to keep in mind:

- Please flatten your cardboard and keep it smaller than 36" x 12".
- Rinse your recyclables.
- No masks or gloves.
- Waxed cardboard is not accepted.
- No plastic bags.
- No diapers, or household wipes.
- Styrofoam is not recyclable.
- Any paper items are recyclable but remember to remove personal information prior to recycling.

Winter Weather Tips

Winter weather causes challenges for residents and waste collection crews. Please follow these guidelines to make collection safe, easy, and efficient for all.



Place your blue boxes and carts in a shoveled or carved-out area on your driveway.



Collection crews begin curbside collection at 7 a.m. Please have all items at the curb before 7 a.m. on your service day. Winter weather may require collection routes to change, resulting in earlier pickup times.



During snow events, make sure your blue boxes and items are visible to drivers and safe to access - place all items in a shoveled area on your driveway or on the ground, NOT on snowbanks. Drivers do their best to complete their routes, although there may be delays due to road and weather conditions. Please check with your municipal website for updates during severe weather.



Keep your drivers safe. Collection crews are not permitted to climb snowbanks to retrieve blue boxes or waste bags. Place items at the end of your shoveled driveway or shovel a shelf for your blue boxes and waste containers.

Follow these tips to keep materials in your blue boxes and not litter the streets:

- Stack the blue bin containing heavier recyclable materials like glass bottles and jars on top of your blue box filled with loose papers/fibers.
- Don't fill your blue box above the rim - fill a second and third box with recyclable materials.
- On really windy days, wait to put your blue boxes out for collection until the following week to prevent litter.
- Blue boxes may blow away when empty, so please take a look around your neighborhood if your blue box is missing on a windy day.



Broken Blue Box - If your box freezes to the ground or the plastic cracks due to the cold, please replace and keep it free from ice to ensure collection.

Write your address on your blue boxes, green bin, and garbage can in permanent marker so they can be returned if blown away during winter weather. This makes it easier for them to be returned.

Thank you for keeping our community clean and drivers safe.



WINTER MAINTENANCE NOTICE

Snow Removal

- Under the Highway Traffic Act Section 181 - Deposit of snow on Roadway, states that "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry of Transportation or the road authority responsible for the maintenance of the road."
- This generally applies to the snow that accumulates in laneways from precipitation and from private or municipal snow plowing operations, those who insist on plowing snow from private property onto public roads can be fined

Overnight Parking

- Residents are reminded there is no overnight parking on Town streets between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- This allows for the Town's Road Crews to plow the roads safely and efficiently, we ask that you please abide by the by-law and be considerate of the road crews when they are out doing their best to keep our roads open and in safe condition

Parking on roadway

- Under the Highway Traffic Act Section 170.

Vehicles interfering with traffic

(12) Despite the other provisions of this section, no person shall park or stand a vehicle on a highway in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of traffic or the clearing of snow from the highway. R.S.O. 1990, c. H.3, s. 170 (12).

Sidewalks

- Under By-Law Business owners are required to maintain the front area of their storefront, this includes the removal of snow
- The Sidewalk Plow will make its way through Town once permissible, Roads are the priority for Works Crew once they are clear Sidewalks

Sporting Equipment

- Please ensure all sporting equipment ie: hockey nets, basketball nets are removed from the curb & roadway

What is FOG?

FOG (Fats, Oil and Grease) is the most common cause of sewer back-ups.

FOG is a by-product of cooking and can be found in butter, margarine, salad dressing, gravies, sauces, lard, shortening, baking goods, meat fats and dairy.

THREE P's

Did you know the sewer system is only designed for the 3 P's?

1. Pee
2. Poo
3. Paper (toilet paper)

ATTENTION: Restaurants, Industry or Commercial premises where food is cooked, processed or prepared: Necessary measures are required to ensure oil and grease are prevented from discharging to a sanitary sewer more than the limits.

What can you do to help?

do:

- collect used grease and cooking oil in a container and dispose of it in the garbage
- wipe out visible fats, oil, grease and food residue from dishes, pots and pans with disposable paper towels
- put solid waste and food scraps in the garbage
- be aware of hidden FOG's in salad dressing, sauces, gravies, cheese and desserts
- use a strainer in the sink to remove excess food debris
- encourage neighbours to keep FOG's out of the sewer system

do not:

- pour oil and grease down the sink, drain or toilet
- scrape food scraps down the sink, drain or toilet
- pour liquid food down the sink, drain or toilet
- run hot water over greasy dishes or pans - the FOG will cool and stick to the inside of the pipes
- use a food waste grinder to get rid of food and grease
- use washable cloths to wipe greasy dishes clean

CAO's Corner

Asset Management – Part 1

Hello everyone! I hope you had a great week. I will speak about Asset Management in this article. Given the importance of asset management, I have broken it down into two articles.

Municipalities are very capital intense organizations. The Town of Petrolia has over \$300 million of capital assets or infrastructure at replacement costs. That is about \$120,000 per residential property! This critical infrastructure is essential for Council to provide the vital municipal services to our residents and businesses. For example, Council cannot provide safe drinking water without our Water Treatment Plant (located in Bright's Grove); the massive water main that brings the treated water from Bright's Grove to our Water Reservoir and Booster Station (halfway between Bright's Grove and Petrolia); our Water

For municipalities, the money is in Asset Management or infrastructure.

I will write further on Asset Management in my next CAO's Corner. In the meantime, I have a challenge for you. The next time you are out walking, running, biking or driving, see if you can spot some of our municipal infrastructure – roads; sidewalks; parks; street lights; all the water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer assets (most are underground); etc. Then ask yourself, if our Town did not have these assets, what would that mean for our businesses and to the quality of life for residents

Tower in Petrolia; and our water distribution system that brings our safe drinking water to every home and business in Town.
