### **Autumn Blaze Maple**

Fire-red Fall colour, virtually keyless, up to 50 feet tall.

Sugar Maple The shape of the sugar maple leaf is well known, as it's found on the Canadian flag and is the national tree of Canada. Sugar maple gets its name from the sweet sap it produces, which is used to make syrup. Other maples can be used as well, but their sap is not nearly as sweet. It takes about 40 litres of sugar maple sap to make 1 litre of maple syrup. Sugar maples can live for more than 200 years. Typically grow to 35 meters tall.

The **Flowering Crab** tree is a small, deciduous tree found primarily in the temperate zone of the Northern Hemisphere. These trees **typically grow to be 4-12 m tall, and possess distinct white, pink, or red petals when in bloom.** 

**Sienna Glen Maple** features showy clusters of red flowers along the branches in early spring before the leaves. It has green deciduous foliage. The lobed leaves turn outstanding shades of orange, red and burgundy in the fall. The furrowed gray bark and brick red branches add an interesting dimension.



- No plastic bags.
- No diapers, or household wipes.
- Styrofoam is not recyclable.
- Any paper items are recyclable but remember to remove personal information prior to recycling.

### PREVENT FOG (FATS, OIL and GREASE) in our sewers

### What is FOG?

FOG (Fats, Oil and Grease) is the most common cause of sewer back-ups

FOG is a by-product of cooking and can be found in butter, margarine, salad dressing, gravies, sauces, lard, shortening, baking goods, meat fats and dairy.

Did you know the sewer system is only designed for the 3 P's?

1 Pee 2. Poo

3. Paper (toilet paper)

collect used grease and cooking oil in a container and dispose of it in the garbage

What can you do to help?

- wipe out visible fats, oil, grease and food residue from dishes, pots and pans with disposable paper towels
- put solid waste and food scraps in the garbage - be aware of hidden FOG's in salad dressing, sauces,
- gravies, cheese and desserts
- use a strainer in the sink to remove excess food debris - encourage neighbours to keep FOG's out of the sewer



- pour oil and grease down the sink, drain or toilet
- scrape food scraps down the sink, drain or toilet
- pour liquid food down the sink, drain or toilet run hot water over greasy dishes or pans - the FOG will cool and stick to the inside of the pipes
- use a food waste grinder to get rid of food and grease - use washable cloths to wipes greasy dishes clean



We appreciate your assistance with this clean up, please be advised that all wreaths, saddles, flowers, etc. placed at the grave are to be removed before these dates to facilitate the clean up

Any wreaths, saddles, flowers, etc.... that are not weathered or worn will not be removed, this includes items placed for Thanksgiving Remembrance. The Cemetery Manager retains final discretion on what is determined as weathered or worn.

Removed items will be held for thirty (30) days at the cemetery office for collection. Items not collected within thirty (30) days will be discarded. The Corporation shall not be responsible for loss or damage to any removed items.

Items Placed on Graves after the 1st week of November: Artificial wreaths and monument saddles without glass or plastic covers may be placed on the lot after the 1st week of November, provided they are securely fastened to the monument. Where there is no monument, it shall be mounted on a stand of at least 30 inches (76.2cm) high and securely anchored to the ground.

Solar Lights:

Solar Lights are only permitted at the Cemetery from November and April. Any Solar lights placed in the fall shall be removed annually prior to the end of April.

- these items are not permitted:
- Glass or pottery containers of any kind
- Hanging baskets, trees, hedges, shrubs, flowering or other plants

of November

prior to Remembrance Day. All Interment Right Holders are required to remove wreaths, flowers, etc. to facilitate the clean-up.

Please remove all items prior to October 31st

- Borders, fences, railings, walls
- or cut-stone coping · Trellises, arches, or iron
- Home made of hand constructed decorative markers ie: metal signage, bird houses, etc.

### CAO's Corner—

### **By-law Enforcement**

Hello everyone! I hope you are finding my CAO's Corner articles interesting and informative. I know that municipal government impacts many important aspects in our daily lives and that municipal affairs can sometimes seem complicated and foreign which can lead to misunderstandings. The purpose of my articles is to help demystify the municipal world.

Municipal Councils, who are elected by their communities every four years in Ontario, approve by-laws for their communities. It is important to remember that by-laws are exactly that - laws.

Municipal by-laws cover a wide range of important topics including financial matters such as loans; legal agreements between the municipality and another person, company, level of government or entity; and appointments. Today I am speaking about our property standard by-laws.

By-laws across municipalities are very similar. One of the key by-laws for property standards is our Tidy Yards By-law which can be found on our Town website. Another important by-law is our Pool Fencing By-law which helps ensure public safety.

Municipal by-law enforcement officers enforce the municipality's by-laws, which were approved by Council when necessary. Like most municipalities in Lambton County, Petrolia uses County staff who are experts in enforcing by-laws. Like other municipalities, we only react to written complaints of an infraction of our by-laws. Once we receive a written complaint, our By-law Enforcement Administration Officer will investigate and determine if the complaint is valid. If the complaint is valid, the Officer will resolve the complaint and have the infraction rectified. The County invoices Petrolia for the costs of investigating and resolving the by-law infraction (costs such as salary and travel costs). If the complaint is justified, these costs are charged to the resident. If the complaint is not justified, the Town absorbs these costs.

We do not provide any information about the complainant. That information is kept confidential.

I would like to thank Jesse from the County who has provided excellent service to our Town over the past few years as our By-law Enforcement Administration Officer. I would also like to welcome our new Officer, Jessica.

One last point, our approach to by-laws and by-law enforcement is standard across the municipal world. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact our Town Hall.
