NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS NOXIOUS WEEDS & LONG GRASS

<u>Weeds</u>

Notice is hereby given to all persons in possession of land, in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter W.5, Section 3, 16, and 23.

That unless noxious weeds growing on their lands within the municipality of the Town of Petrolia are destroyed throughout the season, the municipality may enter upon the said lands and have the weeds destroyed, charging the cost against the land, plus an administration charge as set out in the Act. (Minimum charge per parcel is \$50.)

Long Grass

By-law 80 of 2008 specifies that "weeds and grass shall not be permitted to grow or stand greater than 20 centimeters (8 inches) in height."

Under Section 9.4 and Section 10, if grass is not kept under 20 cm or 8 inches, the Town after notice is given will cut the property grass at the owner's expense.





ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

Please note that certain materials need to be placed in set areas

- leaves
- grass clippings
- weeds/garden plants/shrub clippings/hedge trimmings

brush, capable of chipping (maximum length 6 feet, maximum diameter 4 inches)

Bags or containers of any description are not allowed to remain at the compost site. No animal feces.

COMPOST is available for \$15.00 a cubic yard and may be purchased during regular operating hours. Anyone wishing to purchase compost must bring and load their own containers.

Only residents of Petrolia will be permitted entry to the Compost Site. Identification by Driver's License is required and will be requested on site by the Compost Custodian.

LAMBTON CENTRAL PETROLIA OPTIMIST CORNER!



AWSI COURSE

Assistant Water Safety Instructors

The AWSI Course introduces candidates to the foundation of instructional skills by focusing on the theoretical knowledge that supports learning and teaching.



This course guides the knowledge and skills needed to become an AWSI, by focusing on teaching methods, learning styles, physical principles, progressions, communication, safety supervision and feedback.

Candidates are also provided the opportunity to demonstrate and be evaluated on their understanding of skills and knowledge, through practical teaching experience and hands-on assignments.

Candidates are required to attend and participate in 100% of the course.

Pre-requisite: age 15, able to complete Red Cross Level 10 swim standards - Required for Water safety instructors.

The Water Safety Instructor Course focuses on planning and teaching the Red Cross Swim continuum, instructional emergency response skills and instructional techniques specific to our programs.

The certification issued allows candidates to teach all the Red Cross Swim programs.

Duration: 25 hours (+ 9-11 hours teaching experience)

Prerequisites: Candidates must be 15 years or older and certified as Red Cross Assistant Water Safety Instructors.

Evaluation: All course components, including the teaching experience, are evaluated against specific performance criteria on a pass/fail basis. The performance criteria are located in the Water Safety Instructor Manual.

Certification: Upon successful completion, candidates are certified as Water Safety Instructors, which allows them to teach Red Cross Swim programs.

Recertification: Attend a recertification workshop every two years.


