Discussion:

Councillor Gleeson: Councillor Brown, were you able to attend the scheduled meeting?

Councillor Brown: Yes, I did attend. Tile Yard has been on the books for some time for upgrading, to bring the project up to code the drainage will be effected. The meeting did not go forward as the Engineer did not attend; it has been re-scheduled to be heard tomorrow night. I did notice that there were many residents that had concern and were at the meeting, their views will be heard tomorrow night.

Mayor McCharles: We as a Council did receive a letter of concern from one of the Petrolia residents affected Mr. Johnathan Hart, his concern is valid and we should address that;

Mr. Adams: Mr. Hart was in to speak with Staff and we did explain the process to him and listened to his concerns. He is absolutely welcome to appeal his assessment, as per the notice he received he would do so in writing with the Clerk of Enniskillen Township, 10 days in advance of the meeting. It is possible that Enniskillen may receive the concern the night of the meeting, he would have to inquire with the Clerk of Enniskillen Township to find that out.

Mayor McCharles: Did the Town receive any assessment that we are to pay a portion of the project?

Mr. Adams: Yes, approx.. \$37,000.00 is at a cost to the Town for the road allowance portion.

Mayor McCharles: Mr. Hart seems concerned that he is to pay a cost of an Enniskillen drain project while he is a ratepayer for Petrolia's property taxes.

Mr. Adams: With Mr. Hart's property he does share frontage with this municipal drain that is being worked on, because it is a municipal drain he is accessed under *the Drainage Act* and he is responsible for that footage calculation. If this were a storm drain project in Town and the Town opted not cover the cost to construct it, under *the Municipal Act* a Local Improvement Fee would be calculated and attached to each of the properties involved in the project through a direct fee on their property tax billing.

Councillor Gleeson: Has there been a precedence set for these kind of projects in Town, has there been an example from the past?

Mrs. Pearson: Yes, approx.. 3 years ago residents along Discovery Line were affected by an Enniskillen Township project where Municipal Drains were involved, these residents went through the same process and were responsible to pay the assessment at their cost.

Mr. Adams: the drains when Municipal vs. Storm are very different, the difference between the Municipal Drain and the Storm Drain comes primarily in the design is which accounts for the difference of cost. A Municipal Drain is rated in rate of removal every 24 hours (ie: a 1 inch rate of removal is a high ratio for a Municipal Drain), the Storm Drain is designed with a rate of removal based upon an average 5,10 or 20 year storm design so therefore the pipe here is much larger and the cost is usually $2/3^{rd}$'s more than with a Municipal Drain.

These 9 Petrolia residents affected, there surface water does drain into the outlet for this Enniskillen drain, so they are receiving a benefit from this Municipal Drain.

Mayor McCharles: The long and the short is that there really isn't an alternative option. Either the resident pays for their assessment or the Town pays for their assessment, but either way the assessed value of the project is to be paid.

Mr. Adams: Correct, the only other possible route is if Council directs staff to pursue quashing of the drain through application to the Drainage Tribunal.

With this route the Town would have to contact our own Engineer and seek Legal consult with a Drainage Lawyer.

Mayor McCharles: Council could consider that the Town of Petrolia pick up the full value of the assessment, both the Town's portion and the portion the 9 affected residents have been assessed, and pay this as a general levy expense of approx. the residents cost of \$19,000.00 plus Town road portion of approx. \$37,000.00 for a total general levy expense of \$56,000.00 plus the cost for utilities.

After tomorrow night's meeting at Enniskillen Township and the outcome form that has been relayed back to Council, possibly Council to consider the option of cover the expense portion allocated to the Petrolia Ratepayers affected.

Mayor McCharles: Could it have been possible for Enniskillen Township to provide the Town with the total assessment, for all town properties involved then the Town could have decided what the assessment for each Petrolia Property affected would be?

Mr. Adams: No, unfortunately not because it is under *the Drainage Act*, the process was followed by Enniskillen, the only other option *the Drainage act* would enable was a block assessment to the Town.

Councillor Brown: We do realize the concern the affected residents have as they due pay their taxes for drainage and also now need to pay Enniskillen for a drainage project.

Councillor Gleeson: Possibly staff could look at what other municipalities do in a similar situation.
