

A NEW SIGN TO WELCOME VISITORS TO PETROLIA!

Petrolia just got even friendlier! A new welcome sign at the North entrance to Town is a pleasant sight. The Capital Project for the Town of Petrolia has been in the works for a number of years. Director of Community Services, Dave Menzies, worked with local residents and business owners to come up with a design that would speak to both a modern design, and a timeless appearance.

Pride Signs in Cambridge was the contractor used for the \$45,000 project. Quarried stone was used to symbolize the Town's foundation, rich with history and to symbolize security and stability. The sign is lit at night so it can be seen easily from Oil Heritage Road.

"Petrolia is just about the nicest town you could visit, and this sign is the first chance we have to personally welcome visitors." Said Mayor John McCharles, adding "...staff and residents have done a great job in determining a look that would best suit Petrolia."

Windover Nurseries of Petrolia has donated a pair of matching Sugar Maple Trees and they were planted nearby. The planting of the trees took place this morning on National Tree Day, and is the crowning jewel on the new entrance sign project. The Town wishes to thank Windover Nurseries of Petrolia for the generous donation of the trees.

OPERATION CLEAN SWEEP TAKES TO THE PETROLIA STREETS TO CLEAN UP!

It worked so well in the spring, that Petrolia is planning a second clean-up day. "Operation: Clean Sweep" an initiative by the Town of Petrolia and The Petrolia Volunteer Business Group, started after last winter when the town needed to be refreshed after a tough winter. The second event is planned for Saturday, October 4, from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. with volunteers being invited to meet at the Petrolia Farmers' Market (396 Fletcher Street) for coffee and donuts to get started.

In the spring attention was paid to weeding, garbage and recycling, and sweeping the streets and sidewalks. This fall, the plan is to take another look at garbage and recycling, and to give one last big sweep to the streets and sidewalks before the weather changes. Manager of Town Marketing, Laurissa Ellsworth said "Hopefully, by getting ahead of things in the fall we can avoid some of the spring clean-up." She added, "We had such a great group of volunteers show up in the spring we had the entire downtown, parks and Town Hall finished in the three-hour timeframe."



The planned clean up comes just days before Ontario Contact is due to make site visits to venues in Petrolia regarding the Town's bid to host 2016 Ontario Contact a theatre presenters showcase. Director of Performing Arts, Richard Poore wants to "...put our best foot forward. We know they will love the town and the venues, but any little bit that we can do to set us apart from the other towns vying to host the event the better." The visit is the second phase in the Ontario Contact Committee's process of selecting the host for 2016. Announcements should be made in November regarding the Committee's final decision.

"Volunteering for this event can be counted toward high school volunteer hours and we encourage families to bring their children to this family-friendly initiative." Said Ellsworth. Bring work gloves, a broom and dustpan, and a rake. All garbage bags and recycling bags will be provided. In case of rain the event will be postponed. MOVIES TO BE SHOWN ON THE BIG SCREEN AT VICTORIA HALL

The Petrolia Rotary Club, working with the Town of Petrolia, will host Friday night movies for mature audiences. The Friday night movies will start on October 3, 2014 and with further dates planned through the remainder of 2014 and into 2015. The movies will be \$5.00 for attendees, payable in cash only, and the movies will start at 7pm. The venue will offer a cash bar in the lobby before and after each movie and popcorn will be available to purchase. The first film in the Rotary sponsored series will be "That's Entertainment" featuring various MGM stars from yesterday presenting their favourite musical moments from the studio's 50 year history. An

added attraction at the first film is the addition of the post-show reception, and the invitation to "dress as your favourite movie character".
