### STORM WATER DRAINAGE

### **REAR YARD** DRAINAGE

When there is significantly higher rainfall than average, this contributes to increased stormwater

·Higher stormwater levels can overwhelm any drainage systems, leading to localized flooding and other issues. This is a common challenge many communities face due to changing weather

Public Works actively monitors these significant events and where able take steps to mitigate the increasing the frequency of drain inspections and

Residents can help by ensuring that leaves and debris are cleared from storm drains near their properties. Simple measures like this can significantly improve drainage efficiency.

If you notice any blocked report it immediately to our public works department at to assist you and address any concerns promptly.

#### PREVENT FOG (FATS, OIL and GREASE) in our sewers

#### What is FOG?

FOG clogs!

FOG (Fats, Oil and Grease) is the most common cause of sewer back-ups.

FOG is a by-product of cooking and can be found in butter, margarine, salad dressing, gravies, sauces, lard, shortening, baking goods, meat fats and

Did you know the sewer system is only designed for the 3 P's?

- 1. Pee
- 2. Poo
- 3. Paper (toilet paper)

ATTENTION: Restaurants, Industry or Commercial premises where food is cooked, processed or prepared: Necessary measures are required to ensure oil and grease are prevented from discharging to: a sanitary sewer more than the limits.

#### collect used grease and cooking oil in a container and dispose of it in the garbage

- wipe out visible fats, oil, grease and food residue from dishes, pots and pans with disposable paper towels
- put solid waste and food scraps in the garbage
- be aware of hidden FOG's in salad dressing, sauces, gravies, cheese and desserts
- use a strainer in the sink to remove excess food debris
- encourage neighbours to keep FOG's out of the sewer system

- pour oil and grease down the sink, drain or toilet
- scrape food scraps down the sink, drain or toilet
- pour liquid food down the sink, drain or toilet
- run hot water over greasy dishes or pans the FOG will cool and stick to the inside of the pipes
- use a food waste grinder to get rid of food and grease - use washable cloths to wipes greasy dishes clean

Fully Automated Collection

Begins December 4, 2024

Dear Petrolia Resident.

WM will begin using automated trucks for waste and recycling collection. Carts will be collected weekly.

These trucks use automatic lifting arms to empty carts, making collection efficient and safer for the community.

Two 64-gallon carts will be delivered to each residence over two weeks. Deliveries are scheduled from November 18-29.

WM is excited to provide Petrolia residents with a modern collection system.



### **Important Service Information**

Beginning December 4, 2024, please use your 64-gallon cart with green lid for waste collection and yellow lid for recycling. We encourage residents to optimize the carts and set out for collection when full. Your waste and recycling will be collected weekly.

#### Proper cart placement for automated collection

Remember to place your carts at least 3 feet apart and 3 feet away from any obstacles (trees, cars, mailboxes, etc.) to allow the automatic arm to lift and empty the carts. Place wheels of cart toward house.





The cart with yellow lid is exclusively for recycling - All recyclables should be placed loosely inside the cart. Do not bag your recyclables or place plastic bags or film plastic in the recycling cart. Containers should be rinsed and free of food and liquid. A list of acceptable items are listed opposite page.



Have your carts at the curb the night before or **no later than 7:00 a.m.** on your collection day.



#### Use the cart with green lid for waste -

Place your cart at the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day. You are responsible for cart placement and retrieval. All carts will have a RFID code attached to each address.
