
Tree limbs and branches can not exceed 4" in diameter.





Discover History While Strolling Downtown Petrolia

Petrolia's vibrant and robust downtown speaks to over 150 years of prosperity, the strength of spending locally, and to the importance of community.

As part of the sesquicentennial celebrations in the oil town in 2024, the Petrolia Business Association set out to leave their mark by creating a series of historic posters for the downtown. With funding from the Creative County Grant Program, they were able to create information posters that share with each passerby the historic occupancy and building information for each of Petrolia's storied downtown historic facades.

The project received public input with many residents sharing memories that helped define the timelines of occupants, and the Petrolia Heritage Advisory Committee was quick to provide thorough information where available to fill in some of the gaps in the history.

Posters are placed in a window of each building downtown so they can be explored at your leisure. Residents and visitors are welcome to share in the history of these beautiful buildings, to have a conversation about their memories, or to follow the QR codes on each poster to learn more about the current business and what is offered. PREVENT FOG (FATS, OIL and GREASE) in our sewers

What is FOG?

FOG (Fats, Oil and Grease) is the most common cause of sewer back-up


FOG is a by-product of cooking and can be found in butter, margarine, salad dressing, gravies, sauces, lard, shortening, baking goods, meat fats and

Did you know the sewer system is only designed for the 3 P's?

1. Pee 2. Poo

3. Paper (toilet paper)

ATTENTION: Restaurants, Industry or Commercial premises where food is cooked, processed or prepared: Necessary measures are required to ensure oil and grease are prevented from discharging to: a sanitary sewer more than the limits.



- collect used grease and cooking oil in a container and dispose of it in the garbage
- wipe out visible fats, oil, grease and food residue from dishes, pots and pans with disposable paper towels
- put solid waste and food scraps in the garbage
- be aware of hidden FOG's in salad dressing, sauces, gravies, cheese and desserts
- use a strainer in the sink to remove excess food debris
- encourage neighbours to keep FOG's out of the sewer



- pour oil and grease down the sink, drain or toilet
- scrape food scraps down the sink, drain or toilet
- pour liquid food down the sink, drain or toilet
- run hot water over greasy dishes or pans the FOG will cool and stick to the inside of the pipes
- use a food waste grinder to get rid of food and grease
- use washable cloths to wipes greasy dishes clean
